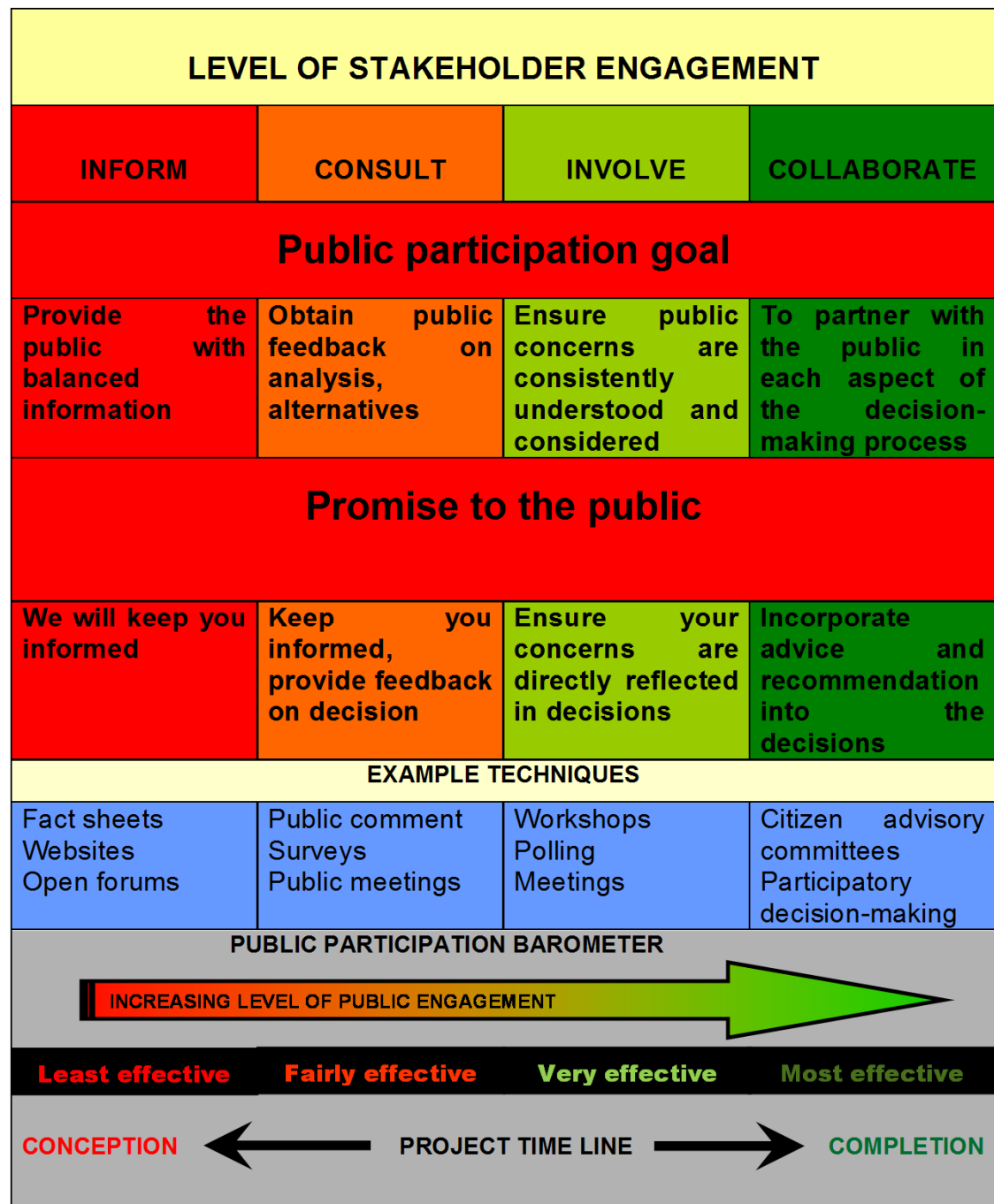

Pracademic - someone who **contributes to academia** and an **active practitioner**

Interested in the notion of **public participation** and **community engagement**

Generally **Public participation** seeks and facilitates the involvement of those potentially affected by or interested in a decision – giving them a voice in the decision-making process

For our purposes today , '**engagement**' will be used as a generic, inclusive term to describe the broad range of interactions between people. It can include a variety of approaches, such as one-way communication or information delivery, consultation, involvement and collaboration in decision-making, and empowered action in informal groups or formal partnerships.



Lesson from my research ...

- Public participation improves the effectiveness and legitimacy of a decision; **builds capacity of those involved; enhance trust among parties**
- Poor engagement and poor planning results in poor public participation and ultimately poor decision-making
- Integration of participation with scientific analysis is needed for participation to be effective.
- Contextual issues such as environmental / social factors and knowledge of stakeholders, influence principles of implementing good public participation
- There is a need for public participation research and methodologies that are scientifically grounded and includes use of new technologies

Relevance to today's discussion ... Responsiveness of the NMMU to its immediate community / inclusion / transformation within context of public engagement

- Traditional view of universities as places of teaching and research
- Universities therefore valuable intellectual resource
- NOT disputed that universities interact with communities in a range of ways
- ? Should community engagement be a core responsibility of higher education
- ? Does such a relationship encourage knowledge driven partnerships that yield mutual benefits

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- ? How can teaching and research directed to critical issues, shape the future of local communities
- Communities = local residents / general public / schools / government / business / NGOs / industry ... etc.

- NMMU not an exclave ... embedded/rooted within Metro community
- Opportunities for university-community partnerships to address “issues”

protests / governance (Municipality) /
unemployment / schooling / youth development /
health / culture (Rhodes must fall) /
entrepreneurship / economics / tourism / drug
abuse / violence ...

- Such partnerships expand role of higher education from passive producer of knowledge to active participant to immediate challenges of communities

HOW do we create **effective** UNIVERSITY - COMMUNITY INTERACTIONS?

- Paradigm shift needed
- NMMU needs to look at its **Transformation Agenda**
 - ✓ Role and relevance of curricula
 - ✓ Looking at communities as 'knowledge-rich' partners
 - ✓ NMMU accessibility as resource to address community challenges
 - ✓ Inter – and transdisciplinary engagements i.e. PAR or Community-based research in Science Faculty
 - ✓ Creating space for 'student voice' in academic encounters
...
 - ✓ Enhance students' capacity to become active citizens and therefore responsive to community issues
 - ✓ Prepare student for the 'world of work' and 'world of life'
... **confidence, self-esteem, motivation, communication**

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- All students active: work integrated learning / internships / inter-organisational exchange / experiential learning
- THUS .. Moving away from lecture-dominated instruction that are still very prevalent in most SA universities

Benefits to NMMU (potentials)

- Improved academic performance
- Greater resource output
- More responsive to societal issues
- Opportunities for innovation
- Abstract theories ... practicalised for both students and academics
- Funding span increase through partnerships
- Increase diversity through cross-cultural engagements
- Relevance to concept of 'nation-building'
