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

- Within the context of a weak economy, with high rates of unemployment and poverty
- Growing pressure on universities for higher levels of accountability and responsiveness to the needs of the broader community
- Fees Must Fall Movement- Questioned -" What is the university doing for the disadvantaged communities of the Metro"
- Diminishing WIL/SL/EL placement opportunities in the formal economy as a result of the economic meltdown and downgrades
- Increased student demands for work exposure ,employability skills and employment

<u>Emphasis this year placed on projects directed at disadvantaged communities- projects involving – Community Interaction Service and Outreach</u> (CISA), <u>Engaged Teaching</u> (ETL) and <u>Professional/Discipline Based Service Provision</u> (PDSP)

Aim of the Colloquium is therefore to (1) provide a brief synopsis and examples as to how the NMMU is responding to the above challenges and (2) to highlight specific engagement projects in disadvantaged communities.


